

J R Beatty ES Title I Parent and Family Engagement Policy
2016-2017

- This policy has been jointly developed and agreed upon by the Beatty ES and parents of students served in the school pursuant to Title I.
- Beatty ES will convene an annual meeting at a convenient time for parents each year to evaluate this policy. This meeting will be held in October. The school's parent involvement policy developed by administration, staff, and parents will be distributed in an understandable and uniform format to parents in a language parents can understand to the extent that is practicable. The parent involvement policy will also be made available to the community. The policy will be published in a school newsletter and/or on the school website.
- The plan is reviewed annually for changes and updates as needed. The plan will be reviewed in May at a parent meeting for recommended changes or additions and will be shared at a parent meeting in October each year. That will allow the plan to be in alignment with the School Performance Plan, NCAAT-S Plan and the Title I Plan.
- The Educational Involvement Accords are integrated into the registration process through Infinite Campus. Parents must review Accords prior to completing their child's registration. Administrators and teachers will have access to the Accords whenever needed for parent/student conferences or other occasions.
- The Beatty ES administration and staff will assist parents in understanding the Nevada Academic Content Standards (NVACS), state and local assessments, Title I information, how to access Infinite Campus Parent Portal to monitor student academic progress, and learning to support student growth and achievement.
- Beatty ES staff participates in on-going Professional Development to provide high-quality instruction based on the NVACS in an environment that effectively supports the learning needs of all students.
- Beatty ES will, with the assistance of parents, provide opportunities for parent involvement that include but are not limited to:
 - Classroom, school and PTA project volunteers
 - Family picnic lunches 2-3 time per year
 - Family Literacy Night and Family Math and Science Night
 - Family Writing Events
 - Coffee and Communities Meetings
 - Parent Academies
 - Participation on the School Performance Plan Team, the NCAAT-S team, and the Title I team
 - Access to teacher websites that provide information and tips to support students at home
 - Opportunity to touch base with teachers at end of day at dismissal
 - Opportunity to set appointments with teachers to conference about student progress or development
 - Parenting classes provided by FACES program
- Information that is sent home to parents related to school and parent programs/ meetings is sent home, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand. Requests for translations other than Spanish will be forwarded to the district. Information from the school and the teacher will be sent home in backpacks regularly.

- A before and after school program, Safekey, is provided at Beatty ES from 6:30 am-7:40 am and 2:11 pm -6:00 pm daily when school is in session. The Safekey program is sponsored and run by Parks and Recreation and is not a Beatty ES or CCSD program.
- The Boys and Girls Scouts program is on campus at Beatty ES. This is a local community program.
- At each meeting or activity related to Title I activities, parents will have the opportunity to provide comments, suggestions, and requests.
- Beatty ES will provide monthly parent trainings and informational meetings to address concerns and questions through Parent Academies and Coffee and Communities meetings.
- Beatty ES will, with the assistance of parents, use information/results from the annual District Wide Parent Survey, to develop/revise the parent and family engagement policy. The results from the survey can be accessed via the school website.
